**MONTHLY ACADEMIC PROGRESSIVE REPORT OF 2081 Magh**

**1. Continuation of Theory and Practical Classes:**

The institute continued its regular schedule of theoretical and practical classes for GM 1<sup>st</sup> year, Physiotherapy 1<sup>st</sup> year, CMLT 1<sup>st</sup> year and CMLT 2<sup>nd</sup> year programs. Faculty members ensured that the curriculum was delivered effectively, with a focus on integrating theoretical knowledge. Students actively participated in theory, practical classes and demonstration classes to enhance their learning experience.

**2. Mental Health and Eye Hospital Posting for PCL Nursing 2nd Year:**

On 27<sup>th</sup> magh 2081, the PCL Nursing 2nd-year students began their 2 weeks Eye hospital and Mental Health Posting. Under the supervision of experienced teachers, students are learning to assess, plan, and implement nursing care for patients with ophthalmic and mental health conditions.

**3 CT/MRI Posting for RG 3rd Year:**

The 2 weeks CT/MRI Posting for Radiography (RG) 3rd-year students started from 27<sup>th</sup> magh. During this posting, students are gaining experience in advanced imaging techniques, including Computed Tomography (CT) and Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI). They are learning about patient preparation, machine operation, image acquisition and interpretation under the guidance of radiologists and technologists.

**4. Celebration of Saraswati Puja:**

On 21<sup>st</sup> magh, the institute celebrated Saraswati Puja, a festival dedicated to the goddess of knowledge, music, and art. The event was organized by AIHS, and all the Amda Hospital staffs, AIHS staffs and students participated enthusiastically. The celebration included traditional rituals, cultural programs and a collective worship ceremony. This event fostered a sense of unity and cultural pride among the institute community.

## **5. Clinical Posting for PCL Nursing 3rd Year**

The clinical posting for PCL Nursing 3rd-year students began from magh 13<sup>th</sup> . Students were assigned to various wards to gain comprehensive clinical experience. The posting included rotations in:

- Antenatal Ward: Students learned about prenatal care, monitoring, and patient education for expectant mothers.
- Postnatal Ward: Students provided care to postpartum mothers and newborns, focusing on recovery and breastfeeding support.
- Labour Ward: Students observed and assisted in deliveries, gaining hands-on experience in managing labor and delivery cases.
- Pediatric Ward: Students cared for children with various medical conditions, focusing on pediatric nursing skills.
- Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU): Students learned to care for critically ill newborns, including monitoring vital signs and administering specialized care.
