As per our curriculum of PCL nursing 3rd year leadership and management, **PHC leadership and management** was conducted from 17th Falgun to 15th Chaitra 2081. 40 students along with 3 instructors (Ms. Sajana Vaidya, Ms. Luna Bista and Ms. Puspa Nepal) of AMDA INSTITUTE OF HEALTH SCIENCE participated in the residential visit.

Residential field objectives:

- To observe the health services available
- To know the organogram of the PHC.
- Identify the structure and functions of central to grass root level health services.
- To identify the problems over there and learn to manage it
- To identify the health needs of the individual clients
- To maintain good interpersonal relationship with health team members
- To supervise the work of the health workers in the health post and clinic
- To Identify the administrative problems at district and health post level and try to solve them in appropriate manner by mobilizing community recourses
- To assign daily work to the staffs and students.
- To give planned in service education to health care staff according to their need.

Activities: During this residential period a total of 40 nursing students were posted at PHC Letang for residential field experience. Each group of 20 students was supervised by 2 instructor/supervisors for 14 /14 days respectively. The total period was of 28 days, during this period each of the students got opportunities to become a student PHC In-charge and carry out task. They assign activities to their sub-ordinates and staff. They provide formal and informal health teaching in different topics like antenatal care, postnatal care, hypertension, diabetes mellitus, etc. They got opportunities to identify the administrative problems at posting ward and tried them to solve using local resources. They conducted two staff development programs by each group during this stay dated 2081-11-17 and 2081-12- 15.

Conclusion:

The posting was designed to enhance students understanding of PHC services, community interaction and develop administrative competencies in a real world setting and it was a valuable learning experience that not only strengthened their clinical and administrative competencies but also enhanced their ability to work both collaboratively and independently in community health settings.
